

Score Like a Champion

Wedge Play Game: Making Birdies

Rules

Set up the practice area with precisely marked distances, every 10 yards, from 30 to 120 yards.

Play 10 wedge shots, one from each marked distance.

In this game, pitching the ball within 2 steps of the target counts as a birdie - if you're a decent putter, you'd expect to hole the putt from this range.

Count the total number of birdies - shots that you land within 2 yards of the target. So, if you are playing a 68 yard shot, and the ball pitches 1 yard long and left of the pin, that's a birdie, even if the ball rolls away from the target. If it pitches 3 yards short, you score zero for that shot, no matter where the ball stops.

Full pre- and post-shot routine for every shot.

Be Accountable

At the end of every round, think carefully about what you have achieved, and the issues you've faced, and write them down in your practice session log.
